Based on Articles 92.4 and 93 (4) of the Constitution of the Republic of Kosovo, Articles 10 and 11 of Law No. 06/L-113 on the organization and functioning of the state administration and independent agencies, Article 39 paragraphs 1, 4 and 6 of Law No. 04/L-240 on anti-dumping and countervailing measures, as well as Article 8.1.4 and Annex 12 of Regulation (GRK) No. 02/2021 on the Areas of Administrative Responsibility of the Office of the Prime Minister and ministries, the Minister of Industry, Entrepreneurship and Trade issues the following:

DECISION

ON DETERMINING THE ANTI-DUMPING PROTECTIVE MEASURE ON THE IMPORT OF CONCENTRATE FOR POULTRY AND ANIMALS FROM SERBIA

1. **Determines** the Temporary anti-dumping protection measure of three Eurocents (€ 0.03) per kilogram on the import of all types of concentrate for poultry and animals originating from Serbia, included in the tariff code 2309905100.
2. The measure from point 1 of this decision is assigned to these exporting subjects:
 - 2.1. FSH “Jabuka” doo Pančevo - Trg Maršala Tita 63, Glogonj 304316, Serbia;
 - 2.2. "Gebi" doo - Maršala Tita 46, 24220 Čantavir, Serbia;
 - 2.3. FSH “Sto posto” doo - Staro Selo, Velika Plana, Serbia;
 - 2.4. FSH “Bečejka” doo - Novosadska 163, 21220 Bečej, Serbia.
3. This decision enters into force immediately.

Reasoning

Following the request of local producers and the proposal of the Commission for the Assessment of Special Duties on Imports, the Department of Trade has begun investigating the import and the sale from Serbia in the market of the Republic of Kosovo of

concentrate for poultry and animals. The investigation was conducted in accordance with the Law on Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Measures.

The Department has found that concentrate for poultry and animals originating from Serbia is sold at lower prices in the market of the Republic of Kosovo than in the domestic market of Serbia. This practice encourages import, by directly and increasingly harming the local producer.

Subsequently, after consulting the Commission and according to paragraphs 1, 4 and 6 of Article 36 of the Law, the Department has recommended to determine an anti-dumping protective measure as in the enacting clause.

Legal advice: This decision is the final act in the administrative procedure. The dissatisfied party may initiate an administrative dispute in the competent court.
